2022 Property Tax Bill Information

Enclosed is your Property Tax Bill for 2022. The tax bill is mailed to the property owner on record. **If you are not the owner of the property described on the tax bill, please notify the Town of Brigham Clerk at (608) 924-1013, ext. 3101 or via email at megan@tn.brigham.wi.gov as soon as possible AND return the statement to the Town of Brigham Office.**

PAYMENT OF TAXES

Taxpayers have two (2) options for paying their tax bill:

1. Pay in Full

Payment is due to *Town of Brigham* **on or before January 31st**.

2. Pay in Installments

If your tax bill qualifies for installment payments, each installment *must* be paid by the due date or the total amount of your remaining unpaid taxes, special assessments, special charges, and special taxes (if any) will be delinquent. Interest and penalties will apply.

- First Installment – Payment is due to *Town of Brigham* **on or before January 31st**.
- Second Installment – Payment is due to *Iowa County Treasurer* **on or before July 31st**.

Payments should include the payment stub located at the bottom of your tax bill to ensure proper posting. Pay in Full and First Installment payments should be made payable to: *Town of Brigham*. Payments will be accepted in the form of check (cashier's or personal), money order, or cash. Follow instructions on your tax bill for Second Installment payments.

CHECK YOUR MAILING FOR MORE THAN ONE TAX BILL! You will receive a tax bill for *each* tax parcel owned. If you have more than one tax bill, **you are responsible for calculating the total amount due on ALL tax bills**; you can contact the Town of Brigham Office to confirm the amount due. Property owners will be notified via email or phone of any payments received that are *less than* the Pay in Full or First Installment amount if an email address or phone number is provided with payment; otherwise, notification will be by U.S. postal mail.

PAYMENT OPTIONS

DO NOT COMBINE OTHER PAYMENTS WITH YOUR PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT!

NEED A RECEIPT? Include your email address with your payment to have your receipt emailed. If you want your receipt mailed, include a #10 self-addressed, stamped envelope with your payment.

PAY AFTER HOURS (DROP BOX)

A 24-Hour Drop Box is located on the exterior of the Barneveld-Brigham Municipal Building to the right of the Main Entrance. Envelopes should be clearly marked "Town of Brigham".

Payments received in the drop box *prior* to 8:00 am will be processed as the *previous business day*.

IN-PERSON TAX PAYMENT HOURS

In-person tax payments can be made at the Town of Brigham Office Monday – Thursday from 8:00 am – 5:00 pm, unless noted, with the office being closed during the lunch hour. Appointments outside of office hours may also be scheduled.

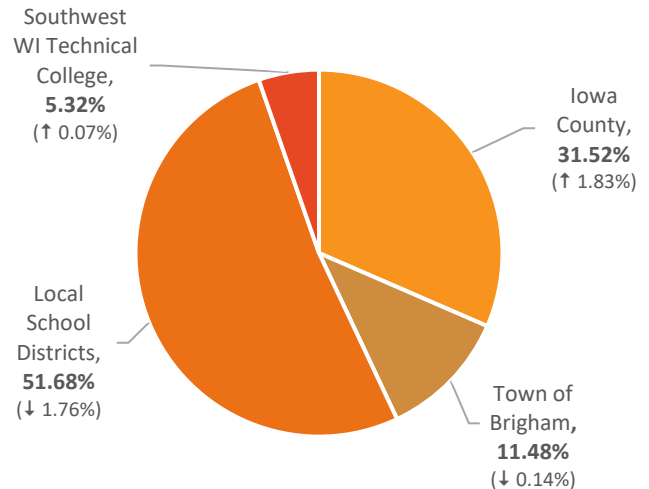
LEVY AND MILL RATE INFORMATION

Your tax bill contains taxes levied by State of Wisconsin; Iowa County; Town of Brigham; local School Districts of Barneveld, Dodgeville, and Pecatonica; and Southwest Wisconsin Technical College.

Although the Town of Brigham acts as the collection authority for these entities, **each entity determines its own tax levy**, as shown.

First Dollar Credit

The First Dollar Credit provides direct property tax relief as a credit for Wisconsin property owners on their property tax bill. Every taxable parcel (business, commercial, or private) containing a real property improvement (i.e. – building), qualifies for the First Dollar Credit. *This credit is automatically applied to all qualifying properties.*

Lottery and Gaming Credit

The Lottery and Gaming Credit provides direct property tax relief to qualifying taxpayers on their property tax bills. To qualify for the Lottery and Gaming Credit, you must be a Wisconsin resident, own a dwelling, and use it as your primary residence as of the January 1 certification date of the year the property taxes are levied. A property owner may claim only one primary residence. *To receive the credit, an eligible property owner must file an application with the treasurer where the property is located.* Contact the Town of Brigham Office at (608) 924-1013, extension 3101, or via email to megan@tn.brigham.wi.gov to obtain an application.
